Dear Parents/Carers,


Have a safe and relaxing break and once again, thank you to all our dedicated staff team and for all your support during this half term.

Finally, we used different methods to join boxes together to make our own bridge.

## RECEPTION

This term we have spent a long time listening to and retelling the story of the 3 Billy Goats Gruff. For our STEM project we soon discovered that the turf outside the class was not green and juicy. The only way the goats could get to the sweet green grass was to cross the bridge, but the **big** problem was that under the bridge lives a troll who wants to eat goats.

"We will have to build a new bridge for the goats."









We have been looking at photos of different bridges from around the world and talked about how they are made. We have used different materials and ways of joining to construct our own bridges then tested them – did they stay upright? Could a goat trip trap over them.?

We have been looking at the names of 2d and some 3d shapes and using words that tell us about the shapes. Now we are finding out what happens when a shape is cut in half....

A huge thankyou from the Reception team to all the families who have been reading 3 times a week at home. Our percentage has doubled in the last week. Superstars!



We hope you all have a safe and restful week at home next week – we may even get to enjoy some sunshine!


We have had a busy few weeks!

We have welcomed Miss Kelly and Miss Lloyd-Hickman into our class. They have been very busy helping us with our learning.

YEAR 1

We have started our STEM project that has been linked to our text in English text – 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' by Ronda and David Armitage. We are making devices using pulleys to help get the plastic out of the ocean after learning about floating and sinking and experimenting with pulleys on a big scale in the hall!

Linked to our book we have learnt all about Grace Darling who was a real person who was very brave who rescued people from a shipwreck! Ask us to tell you all of the facts that we know about her!



In Maths we have been learning about simple multiplication and division including finding equal groups and using arrays. We are now starting our work on fractions (halves and quarters).

In phonics we are busy learning new sounds and building our reading fluency. Please remember to read at least three times a week and record this. Our percentage was better last week 😊 but my aim is 100%!

## YEAR 2

This term we have been working hard on our STEM project.

The children were shocked to discover an area of the school covered in litter and where nothing could grow anymore!

However, the children soon had a plan to change that. They researched, designed, cut, chopped and glued to create 'wasteland warriors' who could transform the wasteland into a wonderland!



# YEAR 3

The Y3 classroom has been converted into a STEM lab for the last few weeks as we have been fully immersed in our STEM project. We have all been working our way through the design process, the highs, and the lows, making our own fossil grabbers to send deep into the rainforest to help our new friends reach some precious fossils stuck, just out of reach, in a sinkhole. The children have really enjoyed making their designs a reality and working through design issues that they found, reflecting on how they might solve the different problems. We were lucky enough to have a zoom meeting with Lapworth museum of geology where the children were told about different fossils, including fossilised poo, and they loved seeing the different rocks glowing under UV light. We have looked at, and held, real fossils and put ourselves in role as paleontologists digging out fossils in our STEM lab, as well as looking at levers, using litter grabbers around the school grounds to collect litter and clean up our shared areas. We have also completed an explanation text about how fossils are created as part of our writing.

Thank you to all that donated cardboard for this to happen, it has been so good to see all the children engage with this project.

Thank you too because we have also improved our home reading scores every week, hopefully this will continue.

A few weeks ago, we all enjoyed Pyjamarama day, where we all went around school and found an alternative place to read a book and we looked at books by our key authors, Anne Fine and Dick King-Smith.

Have a super half term! From the Y3 team.




# YEAR 4

In Year 4 we have been looking at decimals and making this more practical. We have used counters to physically move on a place value grid as well as to use our rulers to measure centimetres and millimetres.

In English we have been linking this to our curriculum work with our STEM. We have had help from Hiccup Horrendous Haddock in How To Train Your Dragon, giving us advice on how we can scare away a terrifying tentacled monster (or is it a friend?).

In Physical Education we have been looking at rounders and the rules of running around each base and where to stay for half a rounder. We progressed this to throwing and catching where we challenged ourselves by standing a variety of distances away from one another.

What a busy and exciting month it has been! Y5 have been extra creative this month as they have fully immersed themselves into the STEM project and completed some beautiful artwork, which will be displayed in our local subway.

#### Kidderminster Art Project

The Kidderminster Art Project was great fun as we were able to work collaboratively to create some fantastic artwork to promote working as community (whether it being a local community or globally) to be environmentally friendly.





YEAR 6

Y6 have been working hard this month in Reading, English and Maths. They are really enjoying the text' The 1000-Year-Old Boy' in Reading where they have been gripped by the cliff hanger chapters and the vivid character descriptions. They have been making some excellent predictions that we are yet to see if they are true!

In Writing, the children have been working hard writing their non-chronological reports on their hybrid animals. We have put together a display of the work in our cloakroom, which looks great! The children have then been writing a persuasive letter in the hope that people can adopt their animal!



In Maths, the children have been finding Algebra hard but this has not stopped them. They have persevered.

Our STEM project has been very exciting over the past three weeks. The children have been making a beacon that signals using light and sound if they were to get trapped in a cave! They have explored electric circuit; used their sawing, hammering and screwing skills; and have also been able to design and evaluate their ideas.
