
#### What are we doing to reward good attendance?

This encouraged the 'Reduce, Reuse, Recycle' focus of the week as we considered the impact of consumer habits. ## **NURSERY**

We have had a lovely term in Nursery welcoming new children into our class. The children went on a trip to the West midlands Safari Park and experienced a bug encounter. They were given the opportunity to hold a large cockroach, stick insect and a chinchilla.







We visited the dinosaurs - they were huge! We also went around the Safari Park on the coach the lions were the children's favourite animal. A very cheeky giraffe stood in front of the coach and wouldn't move until he had eaten his food .

The children were exceptionally well behaved and at the end of the day one of the children said "that was amazing!"

Nursery have enjoyed completing their Cool Earth Week Passport, litter picking around the school grounds and going on a rainbow walk collecting natural materials eg. red, purple, pink flowers yellow and green leaves to make our own colourful rainbow. We planted sunflower seeds; every child has taken one home to care for and watch it grow. The children have also recycled their own t- shirts by sewing a pear and beads on.



### RECEPTION

Reception have had a fabulous start to the second summer term. We have enjoyed revisiting and consolidating our learning on the four seasons; identifying the changes in weather and our outdoor environment, as well as how we can keep ourselves safe in the warmer summer months. As part of their topic 'What's special about Summer?', the children have also enjoyed learning about the beach. We have noticed and discussed similarities and differences between going to the beach in the past and the present, as well as discussing how we can keep ourselves safe at the beach ahead of our exciting school trip!

We had an absolutely brilliant time at the beach and all were really well-behaved. They certainly made St. George's proud! The children enjoyed building sandcastles, eating chips and ice lollies, as well as playing beautifully with their peers. Here are some photos from our trip!











In writing we have been reading the 'Three Little Pigs' and the children have enjoyed retelling the story with their friends, using repeated refrains like "then I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down' and using the construction blocks to build the little pigs houses. Our next text is 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen and already the children are becoming very familiar with the story, writing about the different steps on the journey to the cave.

Year1 have had such a fabulous June!!!

We are all really proud of the children as they have been working really hard on their phonics including getting ready for the Phonics Screening Check. The results will be included in your child's school report.

In Writing we are currently looking at the story of 'The Elves and the Shoemaker' and we have enjoyed writing questions to ask the elf as well as describing some beautiful shoes that we designed! Before that, our text was 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and we enjoyed writing instructions on how to plant a bean! (We got to plant beans too!)

In Maths, we are currently looking at fractions! It sounds scary but we are looking at halves and quarters. We know that halves have to have two equal parts – you can't just cut it into two!

We really enjoyed our strawberry picking trip to Bells Farm Shop and Pick Your Own! We got to pick a whole punnet of strawberries each and we got to take them home too! Earlier in the year we learnt about food coming from plants and we got to see this 'in the wild' which was a great experience! We had to hunt under the leaves to find the best strawberries!





We have also been enjoying 'Cool Earth Week this week! We have made bird feeders, had a 'no paper' day and looked at the effects of an oil spill to name just a few activities we have taken part in! We also used some reused pop bottles to make penguins!

Year 2 have worked so hard this year and it is really paying off! This half term we really deepend our understanding in maths, wiriting and reading.

In Wriiting we have been looking at the book 'Nibbles' and we definitely were in for a treat when Nibbles ate parts of our story so we had to write the rest of the story. He also ruined our school library so we worked very hard to correct this by wiriting Nibbles a set of instructions which were woven into the school's visible consistencies.



In Maths we have been looking at all four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and we have looked at this in terms of measuring in centimetres and metres as well as mass in grams and kilograms. We explored the vocabulary-lighter, heavier, equal to and balance.



In Art, we have been super busy looking at sculptures by Antony Gormley. We explored 'The Angel of the North'. We then explored different properties such as metal, glass, paper and clay to discuss the purpose for each. We then began to create our own sculptures out of clay



I am so proud of how far this class have come this year and how hard they have worked with transition from Year 1 to Year 2. I can't wait to hear all about how they get on in Year 3.

Year 3 have been super busy this half term. In Reading, we have just finished reading The Queen's Nose by Dick King-Smith. This has been a firm favourite for a lot the children and they were very enthusiastic about recording their book review this week.

We have been getting creative in art and D.T. In Art, we have been using plasticine and clay to make Egyptian pinch pots and in D.T we have started to make our Egyptian collars. The children have enjoyed practising their running stitch and cross stitch to add applique to their collars. Take a look at some of our fabulous sewing skills below:









In Maths, we are looking at time and although we might be finding it a bit challenging, we are still enjoying practical element of our maths lessons. Over the next few weeks, we will also be looking at statistics and shape.

This week we have loved participating in Cool Earth Week. We enjoyed a lovely assembly and workshop from Severn Trent and have learnt all about how we can help our environment by reducing the amount of water that we use.







On Wednesday, we absolutely loved when the Harriers came in for a penalty shoot-out. We are so proud of all the children that participated!

Year 4 have continued to busy themselves with all their learning as we move towards the last few weeks of term. In Reading, we have just finished reading The Butterfly lion by Micheal Morpurgo where the children loved the plot twist at the end of the story. In our English lessons we have been writing our own version of the ending to the book 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan and sharing them with each other before finding out how the author finished his story. In Maths, we have completed our unit on fractions and decimals, where we looked at dividing by tens and hundreds and saw how this affected the place value.

In Science, we have continued with our unit on sound and how it can be made louder and quieter and how it travels through the air. In art, we have completed a class piece of art in the style of Keith Haring where every child added their own character. We decided to make the piece around the theme of friendship, and it has made a super display in our intervention area outside the classroom (see photo below). In PE, we have looked at athletics in preparation of sports day and thought about how runners are able to pass the baton successfully in relay races and we have just started to look at the game of cricket.



In Music, we have come to the end of our violin lessons, and we have been using up to three fingers to play a piece of music at different speeds and finishing at the same time. We have also completed our units on Ancient Maya in history and learning about food in our French lessons.

In other areas of our learning, we had a great day out at the Royal three counties show in Malvern where we saw lots of animals getting ready to go into their competitions as well as a bird of prey display and some stunt motorcycles – fortunately the weather was not as bad as they had forecast and we only really had two showers that did not dampen our spirits. More recently we have taken part with the whole school in Cool Earth Week where we completed lessons about renewable energy with a focus on solar energy and we completed an activity each day which focused on Earth and how we can look after it or celebrating what a wonderful place it truly is. Photos below show some of the art we created after a scavenger hunt and things we found out on walks in nature. They also show us doing some of our geography work and maths and English during no paper day and other activities. During this week we also had a visit from Severn Trent and after a whole school assembly we completed a workshop about water consumption where we had to measure out different family's water consumption. We also learnt how we can reduce our water usage by things such as turning off your tap when you brush your teeth, or half filling your bath when you use it to wash. (see photos below)



We have so many exciting things to do over the coming weeks which include the summer fayre, sports day, and leavers assembly so some afternoon lessons could be moving around to accommodate all of these things. Please can PE kits remain in classrooms for the duration of the term, and we will continue to monitor reading at home, which should be at least 5 times a week.

#### Year 5 are continuing to work hard and make fantastic progress with their learning.

In Writing, we have been reactivating our history knowledge about the Anglo-Saxons by looking at artefacts found in the Staffordshire hoard. We used our sticky knowledge and research to create museum descriptions with a grammatical focus on relative clauses.

The children worked incredibly hard and persevered to write at length during this topic; this is something that they should all be really proud of!

For our current reading lessons, we have been exploring a wider range of texts and practising how to break down questions to start to support the class with their SATs in Year 6.

We have had multiple opportunities to explore poetry, which included The Listeners and Last Night, I Saw The City Breathing, the class have enjoyed exploring the vocabulary used in the poems to create clear pictures and sometimes even a sense of mystery.

The class have also started to break down SATs reading papers, it has been good for them to see and practise the questions styles and types that they will come across next year. In our DEAR time at the end of the day, we have still been enjoying texts written by our Year 5 authors as well as Warrior Cats texts chosen by the class.

In Maths, we have been working extremely hard again to prepare for Year 6. Most recently we have been learning about the properties of polygons and 3D shapes. During this topic, the class enjoyed getting the 3D shapes out to help them find the faces, vertices and edges. We have now started our statistics topic exploring coordinates, translating and reflecting. During maths, the class continues to have lots of opportunities to explore solving word problems giving reasons for their methods and answers.

This week we have had Cool Earth Week which the class have thoroughly enjoyed! The children have been engaging in their learning about renewable energy and have used this knowledge to create a green city made from recycled materials. We have also been completing tasks for our Cool Earth Week passports and on Wednesday we enjoyed a no paper day as we ventured outside with whiteboards and chunky chalk.

I have been really pleased with their engagement for Cool Earth Week and I hope the class have had as much fun as I have!









Please ensure your child is reading **5 times a week** and their reading diary is signed and coming into school with them. Please can you ensure they are writing what book they have read as well as the pages that they have read.

We've had a very busy month in Year 6! In history, we have been learning about World War Two and looking at the three major turning points: Dunkirk, The Battle of Britain, and D-Day. The children have then used their knowledge to write informative non-chronological reports about

these events. The children have donned their swim caps as they have started swimming; they have been building their confidence in the water and working on their strokes! In art, we have created sculptures using an armature (wire skeleton) and mod-roc. We have used the artist Henry Moore as inspiration and based our sculptures on the evolution of humans (our topic in science after Christmas)







The children have started Forest School and have enjoyed making smores by the campfire, creating bug hotels, doing team-building activities and drinking hot chocolate!

Our trip to the beach at Weston-Super-Mare was amazing! The children had a fantastic time building sandcastles, playing cricket, eating chips and ice-cream, and just relaxing in the sun. They very much enjoyed burying me...

The children went to the Citizenship Challenge at the Wyre Forest Fire Station. Here they had very important workshops focusing on: stranger danger and not sharing information; fire safety and what to do in an emergency; water and road safety; knife crime; and safety around electrics. The children's behaviour and engagement was exemplary and they will take this knowledge with them as they go to high school.





We have had a very successful Earth Week at St George's. We learnt about the importance of sustainability and recycling. They thought of what legacy they'd like to leave with to look after the school environment. They took part in activities such as litter picking, grounding themselves, and no paper day. We also completed an audit of the school to determine how eco-friendly it is.

The children have started to have their transition days at their new high school. This is an exciting time, and we have many exciting events coming up to mark the end of their time at St George's. Please continue to support your child during the last few weeks of term; this can be a daunting phase of their lives but they are all ready for their next adventure.
